Comments

The Dawncraft 22 sleeps four in comfort and will be equally at home on weekend trips to Tewkesbury and Torquay or a two-week cruise from the Thames to the Trent. The three Dawncraft essentials are here – headroom, ventilation and privacy. This is one of the small cruisers where the galley headroom allows you to stand up to cook a meal. The galley tap pumps fresh water up from a plastic container and included are a fitted perspex sink bowl with plug and waste pipe, and a food cupboard with sliding doors and a wide shelf for utensils. A special feature of the Dawncraft 22 is the cockpit flying bridge, where you can cruise in comfort through inclement weather and makes a second cabin at night. There are two full-size berths forward and the pull-out saloon settee can be converted into a double berth.
